Constantinople "is so strained that the leaders of the organization have no longer any power to hold back the stream of immigration". Mr. Levin reported that crowds of fugitives are swarming uninterruptedly into Constantinople from the surrounding countries on their way to Palestine and are disregarding all barriers.

Washington, Dec. 26th.—Organized railway machinists, through their President, served a notice on Congress today, that they would not submit to enactment of the Commins Railway Bill with its drastic anti-strike provision. Voting more than a month ago, 98 per cent of the 125,000 members of the Union favoured an immediate walk-out in event of the Bill's passage by the Houses of Congress, but the result was not made known, through fear that the brotherhood might appear in the light of attempting to coerce the law-making branch of the Government.

The Post Office desires to bring to the notice of the public that the sale of War-savings Certificate Stamps of the series of 1919 will cease at close of business on December 31, 1919, and that War-Savings Stamps of the series of 1920 will be placed on sale beginning January 1, 1920. The 1919 stamps POSITIVELY WILL NOT be sold after December 31, and to avoid disappointment as has proved the case when previous issues were no longer obtainable, patrons and those wishing to complete collections, are advised to secure their stamps before that date. The 1920 issue of W. S. S. is printed on white paper with white lettering on a red ground, and contains a photogravure of Washington, the general design being the same as in former issues.

IT is hereby made known that the Horse, Carriage and Boat Tax for the first half year 1920 will be received by the Policemasters in Christiansted and Frederiksted from the 20th January to the 10th February 1920, both days included, after which the list of arrears will be transmitted to the same authorities for further measures.

Each debtor of tax will be subject to a fine Frcs. 1.00 if the tax be under Frcs. 25.00 and Frcs 2.00 if the tax be Frcs. 25.00 or above, beside the ordinary levy expenses.

FROM THE POLICE.

ALL owners of dogs are enjoined with in the ending of January month to procure from the Police Office (for Kingshill District from Kingshill Police Station) the signs for dogs prescribed by the Police Regulations, which according same must always be worn by the dog, and for which Francs 10.00 must be paid for dogs in town and Francs 2.00 for dogs in the country.
