PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

COLONIAL COUNCIL

FOR ST. CROIX.

AT one o'clock p. m., Monday, May 17, 1920, the Colonial Council of St. Croix held an extraordinary meeting at the Colonial Council Hall in Christiansted convened by request of Government.

The following members were present: The Acting Chairman (Merwin), F. Coulter, A. J. Blackwood, F. Lunney, K. Hendersen, M. M. Sheoch, D. Noll, W. H. MacKay, W. S. Abramson, G. Nordby, D. C. Canegata, G. B. Fleming and Thos. Ramsay.

Despatching Secretary (Commander Colby) attended the meeting.

The Acting Chairman [Merwin] asked 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) to act as Secretary to the Council until the Officials of the Council are elected.

After prayers had been said the Actg. Chairman remarked: Honorable Members the minutes of the last meeting have been published as customary in the "St. Croix Avis" and if members have no objections I will consider same tacitly adopted.

There being no objection the Actg.

Chairman declared the minutes as published tacitly adopted.

The Actg. Chairman further remarked: I have received no notifications from absent members of their inability to attend the meeting.

The Acting Chairman then laid before the Council Item 1 of the Order of the Day.

Item 1.

Elections Official of the Council.
Election of a Chairman.

12 voting tickets were handed in, one was blank 2nd Member for Frederiksted Town (Merwin) was elected with 11 votes.

The Chairman (Merwin) took the chair and thanked the members for re-electing him chairman of the Council for another year and expressed the hope that he would be able to conduct the meetings satisfactorily.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) entered the meeting.

Election of a Vice-Chairman.

14 voting tickets were handed in and 1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Coulter) was elected with 9 votes.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll), 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (MacKay), 5th Appointed Member [Lunney], 2nd Member for Christiansted Town [Canegata] and 2nd Member for Frederiksted Country District [M. M.

ORDER OF THE DAY

for an extraordinary Meeting of the Colonial Council for St. Croix, TUESDAY, May 25, 1920, at one o'clock p. m.

[Convened by request of Government.]

1. Election of men to take part with Government in deciding on applications to be made of their Majesties King Christian IX and Queen Louise of Denmark's Golden Wedding Legacy.
2. Election of do. of their Royal Highnesses Crown Prince Frederik and Crown Princess Louise of Denmark's Silver Wedding Legacy.
3. Election of do. of the Nuptial Fund of His Roy l Highness, Prince Valdemar of Denmark.
4. Election do. of the P. C. Birch and wife Rosaline Antoinett's legacy to the poor of St. Croix.
5. Colonial Council Bill No. 29. Continuation of 3rd Discussion on Draft of an Ordinance introduced by Government establishing and declaring the organization of the Judiciary and Educational Departments of the Virgin Islands of the United States etc. with amendment.

Election of a Secretary.

15 voting tickets were handed in and 2nd Member for Christiansted Town [Canegata] was elected with 14 votes; 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District [MacKay] received one vote.

Election of an Assistant Secretary.

15 voting tickets were handed in, one was invalid. 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] received 6 votes; 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District [MacKay] received 5 votes, and 3rd Member for said District [R. W. Skeoch] received 3 votes.

As none had absolute majority vote a new voting had to take place.

15 voting tickets were handed in and 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (MacKay) was elected with 8 votes.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] received 4 votes, 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (R. W. Skeoch) received 2 votes and 3rd Appointed (Armstrong) received one vote.
