PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

COLONIAL COUNCIL

FOR ST. CROIX.

AT one o'clock p. m., Saturday, April 2, 1921, the Colonial Council of St. Croix held an extraordinary meeting in the Council Hall in Christiansted.

The following members were present:

The Chairman (Merwin), F. Coulter, D. S. Armstrong, D. Noll, G. Nordby, G. B. Fleming, F. Lunney, Robt. W. Skeoch, A. J. Blackwood, W. S. Abramson, F. Andersen, M. M. Skeoch and D. C. Canegata.

The following members were absent: 3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Pentheny) 1st Appointed Member (Henderson), 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (Mac Kay) and 4th Member for Christiansted Country District (Ramsay).

Member Stakemann sent in excuse of his inability to attend the meeting owing to his absence from the island.

Despatching Secretary Fox attended the meeting.

Owing to the absence of the Secretary the Chairman asked 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) to act as Secretary to the Council.

After prayers had been said the Chairman remarked; Honorable Members the minutes for the last meeting have been published as customary in the "St. Croix Avis" and i members have no objection I will consider same tacitly adopted.

Member Coulter remarked: Mr. Chairman. In the printed report of the proceedings I find that I am credited as saying that "The Director of Police is not responsible for the acts of the Police etc.", I ask that this remark be expunged from the record, as I did not make that statement.

Member Andersen remarked: I am quoted as having said that the cost of maintenance for a concrete road is

about one Thousand Dollars per mile per year. I request that this be corrected to read one Hundred Dollars for a concrete road and about one Thousand Dollars for a macadamized road.

It was put to the vote and carried that the remark be expunged from the record

There being no further objection the minutes were tacitly adopted.

The Chairman then made the following remarks: Since the last meeting of the Council I have received no communications from Government to read to the Council.

I have received a letter from 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (Mac Kay) reading:

"Estate Concordia, 31, March, 1921.

Robt. L. Merwin, Esq.,

Chairman of the Colonial Council, St. Croix. Sir: As I find it absolutely impossible to attend to my duties of the Colonial Council, I beg to tender my resignation as 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District, which I beg the Council to accept.

The Chairman remarked: This matter will be discussed after the Order of the Day is disposed of.

The Chairman further remarked: I have received today the following telegram from Bornn Agents Barber Asphalt Paving Company reading:

"Merwin, Chairman, Colonial Council, Christiansted. Sending you next mail particulars superiority Asphalt roads over cement. St. Thomas. Urgent.

The Chairman continuing said,—I can only state that Mr. Bornn should consult the Public Works Officer and not me; however, I feel it my duty to read the telegram to the Council.

The Chairman then brought up item 1 of the Order of the Day.

Item 1.

Colonial Council Bill No. 55.

Continuation of 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 55, draft of an ordinance providing for the sum of Frs. 250,000.00 to rebuild with concrete the center line road between Frederiksted and Christiansted in accordance with plan approved by the Public Works Officer, introduced by 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) with Committee Report.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) remarked. Mr. Chairman. The Committee appointed to report on this bill discussed the ordinance in detail and have submitted a report with the following amendments (the member read the amendments) and continuing said,—Instead of leaving the decisions with the Public Works Officer.
