It is learned that a movement is on foot within the Department of Education

Governor Oman has ordered a General Court-martial today for the two enlisted men who created the disturbance on "King's wharf" last Sunday, the charges preferred against them are alleged drunkenness, using obscene language, assault and resisting arrest.

The U. S. S. BEAUFORT arrived yesterday with a cargo of gasoline for the Naval Station and will sail today.

At a meeting of the Food Commission held August 10th, at which the Chairman and Holst, LaBeet, Daniels, and Dunlop were present, it was unanimously agreed that in their opinion action heretofore taken and matters as arranged by them appear to be reasonable and just, but they felt the time may be ripe for them in the interest of the community to give way for others to consider the situation. The Chairman and the members present thereupon jointly submitted to the Governor a request to be relieved from membership on the Commission with the recommendation that new members be appointed in their stead.
