ST. CROIX STATION.

Kingston, Jamaica, May 26th.—The following resolution was unanimously adopted at a joint meeting of the members of the Jamaica Imperial Association and the Jamaica Chamber of Commerce and Merchants Exchange yesterday. "That this meeting while recognizing the desire of the Canadian Government to modify its actions in connection with the repeal of the dumping clause by re-instating same to the extent of three quarter cent per pound, desires to point out that any alteration in the dumping clause is apparently inconsistent with the terms of the West Indies trade agreement 1921. It urges that there should be a reconsideration of the Dutch standard test so that the duty on all sugars from the British West Indies and British Guiana should be assessed not on a colour test but on a polariscopic test, thus allowing British sugars fit for direct consumption to enter the Canadian market and enjoy preference without special restrictions. It emphasizes the fact that the maintenance of the Dutch Standard colour test in connection with all sugars other than those entitled to preference under the West Indies trade agreement 1921, will afford protection to refiners without interfering with the growth of trade relations between the British colonies referred to and the dominion of Canada. That a committee consisting of Hon. Horace V. Myers (Chairman) Hon. J. H. Phillips, Messrs A. M. Henderson, P. A. Bovel, William Gamble, J. B. Stiven, W. B. Gray, A. W. Farquharson, George Taylor and Kelly Lawson, with power to add to their number, be appointed to make representations through the Government of Jamaica to the Canadian Government, and that such committee act in concert and with West Indian Associated Chamber of Commerce, the West India Committee and the several chambers of commerce of the British West Indies and British Guiana.
