TELEGRAM.

ST. CROIX STATION.

New York, Nov. 8th.—Substantial re- duction in the price of cotton goods were announced here today by several firms. Percale prices have been cut down from last seasons 30c. a yard to a thirteen and a half cent basis. Stan- dard prints were priced for the new sea- son at 12½c. a yard, a drop from 23c. a yard. For 2.20 denies white back, 25c. is now asked and for 2.40 double and twist goods, 21½c. These goods ranged in price during the fever of speculation in second hands from 53 to 57c. a yard.

Minneapolis, Nov. 8th.—Flour prices today continued their downward slide and reached what millers said were war prices. At one large mill family patent flour declined forty cents a barrel to a new low price of ten dollars. This quo- tation was for car lcts in 98 pounds cot- ton sacks.

New York, Nov. 8th.—The market for raw sugar was unsettled today and while no fresh business was reported there was considerable sugar available at prices of 6½c. for Cuba's equal to 7.52 for centri- fugal. Refined was in slight demand and confined to nearby requirements. Prices were unchanged at 10.50 and 11.00 for fine granulated. The increased offer- ings in the stock market led to renewed selling in sugar futures and prices broke
