St. Thomas News.

It will be of interest to pleasure seekers to learn that the British motor-boat "Annie Anderson" of Tortola, Capt. A. R. Titley, Jr., will make bi-weekly trips between the two ports, taking passengers and freight. Round trip \$1.50 Charters will also be received.—*St. Thomas Mail Notes, Feb. 15th.*

The contract for the mail service between Porto Rico and here by the motor-schooner "Mystery" has not been accepted by the Postal Authorities at Washington, inasmuch as other bids were probably withheld owing to the schedule.

As money is no consideration in the matter, a steamboat to do the service would be gladly hailed.

On Thursday afternoon last, there was a meeting of the Colonial Council held, which was presided over by the Vice-Chairman, the Hon'ble C. G. Thiele, in the absence of the Chairman, who came late.

Owing to certain amendments in connection with the taking over of the telephone system by the Government, and which were introduced by same, the 3rd Discussion on the proposed Bill did not take place.

The completion of the reading of the New Code of Laws was however effected.

We regret very much, however, that the last chapter, 38, of Title IV, dealing with illegitimate children, and the provision made for their support, was not more fully and ably discussed, providing as it does such wide scope for debate, pro and con.
