TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

New York, Jan. 14th.—German gold estimated at between ten and twelve million dollars has been deposited this week with the New York Federal Reserve Bank, it was learned yesterday, evidently in anticipation of the payment to be made under the moratorium. The funds were sent to the Institution as the designated depository of the Allied reparations commission by the accredited banking representatives of the Reichsbank. The aggregate shipment is approximately \$1,190,000.

London, Jan. 15th.—The last test match in the Australian Rugby tour, played at Salford on Saturday, under the Northern Union rules, was watched by 18,000 spectators and proved to be a most exciting game. At the commencement the Australians attacked frequently, but met with a stout defence. England put up a fine performance, Hilton scoring the first try. The second try for England was the result of fine dribbling work. By winning this game England takes the rubber, having won two and lost one.

Manchester, Jan. 15th.—Lord Derby addressing the Lancashire division of the Nationalist Unionist Association on Saturday said a vast majority of conservative opinion in Lancashire were opposed to the holding of an immediate election and in their name he appealed to the Prime Minister to postpone holding it.

Lisbon, Jan. 14th.—Portugal as an ally of Great Britain is taking great interest in the proposed Anglo-French treaty negotiations at Cannes and the

sentiment shown in Governmental and Parliamentary circles is distinctly favourable to ratification of the pact by Portugal it is concluded according to the local papers the British Minister has conferred with various Portuguese personages concerning the attitude Portugal will adopt in the event an alliance is concluded, between Great Britain and France.
