PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from Saturday's Avis.)

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. My understanding is the minute the Committee send in its report it ceases to exist. It seems to me the only thing to do now is to recommit the bill until we have some idea as to how much it would cost to work the road roller, then we can bring in a bill for the maintenance of it.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeech) remarked: Mr. Chairman. What the 2nd Member for Christiansted Town has said is very true, but how are we going to get our knowledge? Hadn't we better get the proponent of the Bill to find out something about what it would cost to maintain the road roller? They have road rollers in the English Islands and in Porto Rico, but they are much richer than we are here. Barbados, I believe, is a very economic country, I propose that information be obtained from Barbados as to the probable cost of maintaining a road roller.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. As one of the Members of the Committee appointed to receive and report on the Money Bill, I understand we were to suspend all discussions on Bill No. 14 until we get the road roller; and it was recommended that the road roller be put under the control of the Public Works officer. I suppose then we should get an estimate from the Public Works Officer as to the probable cost of maintaining the roller. It is almost impossible for us to compare notes with the neighboring islands, considering that conditions here are different to those existing in the neighboring islands. Some of our roads only need reconstruction and some need repairing; these matters we can thrash out when we get the road roller. It was stated here that maintenance for the roller will come out of next year's budget, with that understanding I do not think many members gave much thought as to how we should raise funds to maintain the roller.

The Member then read a statement as to number of cars, trucks etc., operating on the island and the revenues derived from them and the revenues derived from the boat, horse and carriage tax and said,—I believe that would be sufficient and ample to keep our roads in fine condition. I have an estimate for working rollers in Porto Rico which was published in the papers, but I do not know if any member has read it. They have excellent roads in Porto Rico.
