OFFICIAL NEWS.

January 16, 1919.

Lieutenant Erik J. Hakansson, Medical Corps, U. S. Navy, has been ordered detached from duty in St. Thomas upon the reporting of his relief who is expected to arrive via the U. S. S. Henderson. It is probable, however, that Lieutenant Hakansson will continue on duty as Chief Municipal Physician in St. Thomas for about three months and then proceed to Washington, D. C., for duty in the Naval Medical School.

Fifty Marines will arrive in St. Thomas via U. S. S. Henderson for duty in the Virgin Islands, and all duration of war men and reserves will be returned to the States on that ship.

U. S. NAVY PRESS NEWS.

WASHINGTON: Brigadier General Charles M. Lauchheimer of Marine Corps died last night at the naval hospital here following a stroke of paralysis. His illness dates from last July when he suffered a stroke upon his return from a tour of inspection throughout the West.

WASHINGTON: Harry V. Learned and Harry O. Martin, sailors of the U. S. Submarine Chaser Pocomoke, who
