PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

ORIGINAL SECTION 65 becomes Section 53. Strike out the word "collector" in second line and insert the word "Secretary", and insert the word "this" after the word "or" in said second line.

ORIGINAL SECTIONS 66 and 67 become Sections 54 and 55 respectively, but to remain the same.

ORIGINAL SECTION 68 becomes Section 56. Strike out the word "registrars" in second line and insert the word "Recorders".

ORIGINAL SECTION 69 becomes Section 57. Strike out the word "registrars" in second line and insert the word "Recorders".

ORIGINAL SECTION 70 becomes Section 58. Strike out the word "registrars" in second line and insert the word "Recorders".

ORIGINAL SECTION 71 becomes Section 59. Strike out the word "registrar" in second line and insert the word "Recorder"; strike out the words "proper collector" in fourth and fifth lines and insert the word "Secretary", and insert the word "his" after the word "or" in fifth line and in last line strike out the word "registrar" and insert the word "Recorder".

ORIGINAL SECTION 72 becomes Section 60. Strike out the word "collector" in second line and insert the word "Secretary"; insert the word "his" after the word "or", insert the word "due" after the word "serve" in second line; after the word "property" in third line strike out the words "in the manner prescribed in Section 50 of this Ordinance"; insert the word "and" before the word "that" in fourth line; strike out the word "collector" in seventeenth line and insert the word "Secretary", and before the word "agent" in said line insert the word "his".

ORIGINAL SECTIONS 73 and 74 become Sections 61 and 62 respectively. Change the word "collector" to "Secretary" wherever found in these sections.

ORIGINAL SECTIONS 75 and 76 become Sections 63 and 64 respectively. Strike out the word "personal" wherever found in these sections.

ORIGINAL SECTION 77 becomes Section 65. Strike out the word "collector" in first line and insert the word "Secretary"; strike out "65" in tenth line and insert "53" and strike out the word "registrar" in third and thirteenth line from bottom and insert the word "Recorder".

ORIGINAL SECTION 78 becomes Section 66. Strike out the word "registrar" in eleventh line from bottom and insert the word "Recorder".

ORIGINAL SECTION 79 becomes Section 67 but to remain the same.

ORIGINAL SECTION 80 becomes Section 68. Strike out the word "registrar" in second and tenth line and insert the word "Recorder".

ORIGINAL SECTION 81 becomes Section 69. Strike out the word "collector" in fifth and seventh line and insert the word "Secretary", and strike out the word "registrar" in second and eleventh line from bottom and insert the word "Recorder".

ORIGINAL SECTION 82 becomes Section 70. Strike out the word "registrar" in third line from bottom and insert the word "Recorder".

ORIGINAL SECTION 83 becomes Section 71. Delete Ordinance of February 22, 1855 being the Horse, Carriage and Boat Tax which was suggested to retain in place of the Tax on personal property, and after the word "effective" in last line strike out "December 31, 1921 and insert "three months after the ordinance has been passed by the Colonial Council and approved by the Governor".

The *Chairman* remarked: Honorable Members. This bill was introduced in the Council sometime ago and sent to a Committee of the whole Council and was by that Committee sent to a sub-Committee of five members, and the sub-Committee after holding several meetings sent in its report which has been approved by the Committee of the whole Council and transmitted to me, and which is now before you for discussion.

Despatching Secretary (*Rappolee*) remarked: Mr. Chairman: The Ordinance as originally introduced contained a provision for taxing personal property, the sub-Committee has eliminated that item and Government would very much like to hear the reason for such elimination.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (*Canegata*) remarked: Mr. Chairman. It seems to me that members expect me to speak on the question. This matter was sent to a sub-Committee and I was appointed Chairman of that Committee. I made my report to the Committee of the whole Council, I am not the Chairman of that Committee, and therefore I cannot speak for it, if I do I would be assuming someone's privilege.

4th Appointed Member (*Blackwood*) proposed that 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (*Canegata*) elucidate why personal tax has been eliminated from the ordinance.
