STEAMER BURNS AT SEA.

All of the 217 passengers, officers and members of the crew were rescued by other vessels when the steamship City of Honolulu was destroyed by fire while over 600 miles from port, San Pedro, Cal. Betty Stanhope, telephone operator remained at her post until the last minute. While flames and smoke roared about her she bravely sent and received messages which contributed much to the orderly abandonment of the vessel without loss of life.—*The Pathfinder*, Nov. 4th.
