PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

At one o'clock p. m., Monday, June 20, 1921, the Colonial Council of St. Croix held its 1st. Ordinary Meeting for the present elective period in the Colonial Council Hall in Christiansted.

The following Members were present: The Vice-Chairman (Coulter), A. J. Blackwood, W. S. Abramson, J. Alexander, Robt. W. Skeoch, G. B. Fleming, F. Andersen, D. S. Armstrong, D. C. Canegata, K. Henderson, Thos. Ramsay.

Commander Gaffney and Despatching Secretary (Fox) attended the meeting.

The Chairman (Coulter) remarked: Honorable Members since the last meeting of the Council no communication has been received from Government.

The greater part of the proceedings having been printed, I will ask the Assistant to the Council to read the balance of the report of the last meeting.

Accordingly the balance of the proceedings were read by the Assistant.

The Chairman remarked: If none of the members have objections to the minutes as printed, and read, I will consider same tacitly adopted.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) remarked: Mr. Chairman. In the Government Secretary's remark, where it reads: "this matter was presented by 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch)" there is a slight mistake, it should read: "this matter was presented by 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen).

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I spoke to Secretary Timmons not as 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District, but quite privately.

It was put to the vote and carried that the record be changed as above.

There being no further objection the minutes as published, read, and corrected, were tacitly adopted.

The Chairman remarked, Before we proceed to the order of the day, I will ask the Secretary to the Council to read a resume of the proceedings of the Council for the last fiscal year.

Accordingly the Secretary (Canegata) read the resume, which is as follows:

RESUME

of the proceedings of the Colonial Council for St. Croix for the elective period 1920--1921.

The ordinary meetings for the fiscal year were fixed as follows: Monday, June 14, 1920, Monday, August 16, 1920, Monday, October 18, 1920, Monday, December 13, 1920, February 14, 1921, and April 18, 1921.

The first session of the elective period was opened on June 14, 1920.

The following Ordinances, Resolutions and Bills were introduced and disposed of in the course of the elective period:

1. Colonial Council Bill No. 33.

Resolution, introduced by Government re Teachers Supporting Fund, Adopted June 14, 1920.

Approved by the Governor July 2, 1920.
