LOCAL

The machinery of Peter's Rest Station which has been discontinued as a grinding centre, is now assembled on the wharf certain parts being boxed in readiness for shipment to St. Kitts by vessel calling for that purpose. It is understood these works will be installed in a factory acquired in St. Kitts by Mr. A. W. Elliot of Est. Mt. Pellier here.

The hot weather continues. There was a pretty fair shower of rain yesterday morning and from Frederiksted there is reported a heavy fall at noon. Much more rain is still urgently needed or there will be practically no crop next year.

The latest business oddity is the scarcity of sole leather in the local market. We have to be shod with iron or some other material while this lasts. There is likewise a shortage of building cement

on which account some undertakings have been postponed. Cement sells for anything around \$12 a barrel and we read in a recent Danish paper that a shipload had been sent to Haiti not so long ago.

The schooner Vigilant making the trip from St. Thomas with the mails has not yet arrived, owing probably to the calmness of the weather.
