TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Dublin, Jan. 20th.--Michael Collins, Minister of Finance in the Provisional Parliament, will start tonight for London to join the Irish Ministers already in consultation with the Imperial Cabinet Committee. He will be accompanied by the Secretary of the Provisional Government.

London, Jan. 20th.—The legislative assembly of India today rejected a resolution recommending the abandonment of the Govts. policy of repression, cables Reuter's correspondent at Delhi.

Washington, Jan. 20th.—The American proposal to lay openly before the world all the treaties and understandings that relate to China, met with an unexpected set back today, when it came before the Far Eastern committee of the Arms conference for formal adoption. Although such a step had been agreed to yesterday in principle, the problem of defining the exact scope of the agreement precipitated a long debate and after several changes had been made in the draft presented by the American delegation, final action was postponed at the suggestion of Japan. The Committee did adopt, however, a resolution expressing the hope of the powers that China speedily would reduce the large military forces now maintained within her borders. Meantime in another subdivision of the conference, the ground work was laid for another international gathering, which some delegates seemed to regard as a partial realization of President Harding's plan for a continuing series of meetings to discuss world affairs. headed by Elihu Root, approved a resolution putting over a revision of the rules of warfare to a future conference, which it is contemplated shall be called by the United States in the near future.
