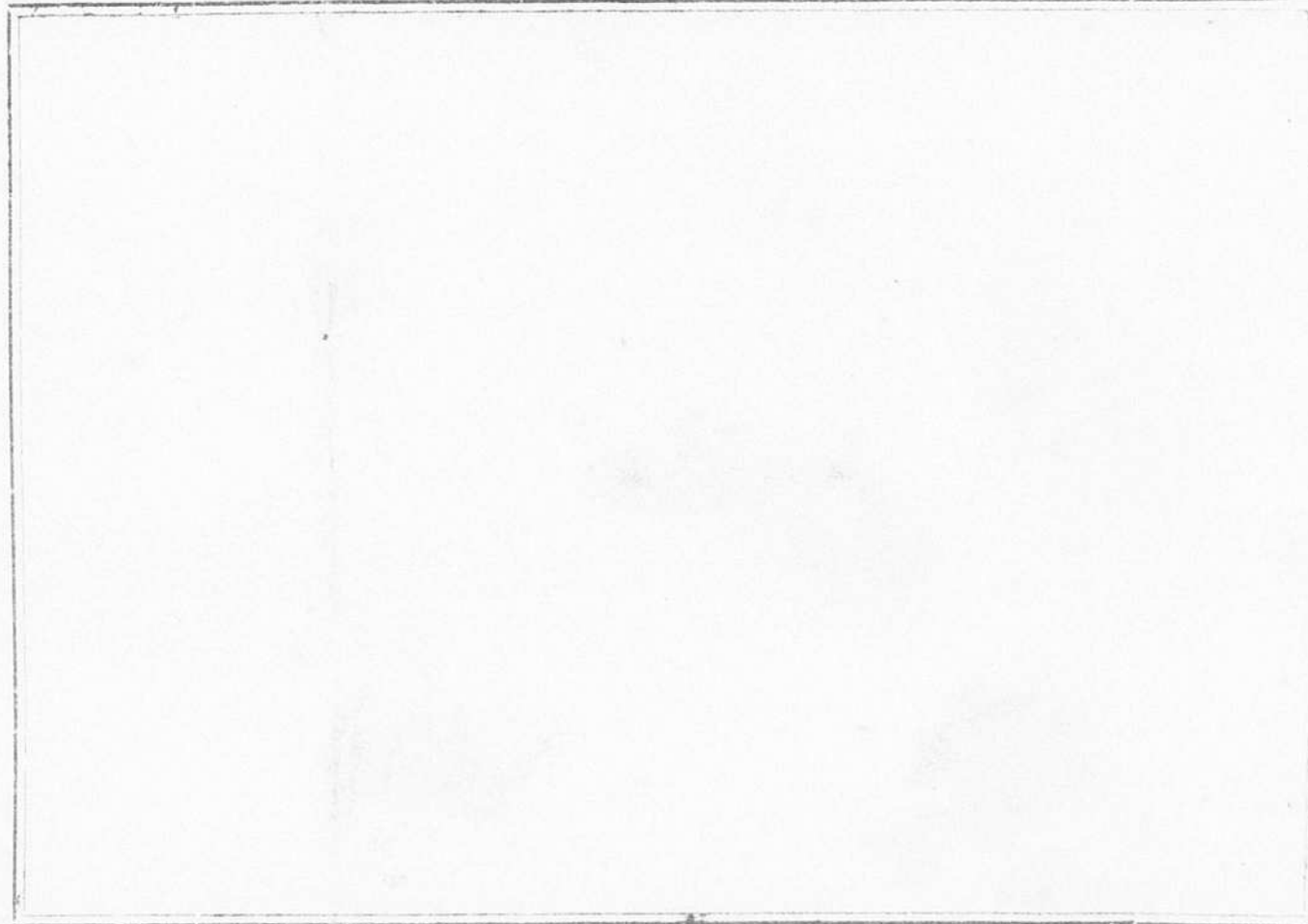
ST. CROIX STATION.

Buenos Aires, July 10th.—Unofficial advices received by the newspaper La Nacion from Rio Janeiro and Port Alegre, Brazil, by way of Montevideo, assert that the rebellion at San Paulo is far from being dominated by the Government and that the state of Parama and of the state of Rio Grande have declared insurrectionary movement.

Paris, July 9th.—The United States was the victor in the Olympic trap shooting events, which ended today, piling up a score of fifteen points. Hungary was second with ten, Finland third with 9, Canada fourth with 8 Belgium fifth with 6, Czechoslovakia sixth with 3, Austria seventh with 1.

St. Johns, N. F. July 9th.—This afternoon the members returned to the local assembly in the recent general election were sworn in before a local commission of three legislative councillors. Tomorrow afternoon the House opens for the first session under the Monroe Government. During the session, which is expected to be a very brief one, the new administration will deal with legislation to ensure the establishment on the Gander River of a 1,000,000 pulp and paper plant. It is rumored in Government circles that the speaker of the House will be Mr. Cyax, representative of the District of Johns East, while the Deputy Speaker and Chairman of Committees is Mr. Pudleston, Member for Bay Dever district.
