EDITORIAL.

To those interested in knowing where we stand in the question of Judge Malmin's dismissal, we have but a few words to say. Our editorial policy or opinion is solicited and we frankly admit we have none to express for the simple reason that we consider this matter an administrative affair about which we do not know enough to say empty things that might please or tickle some without offering any real solution to the problem, if it is one. We are taking the same attitude other papers have taken in similar questions in which it did not suit them to get mixed up. Those who have made a systematic study of misrepresenting this paper even when to support it would have been for the public welfare, and declared its opinion to be the voice of the minority, can surely have nothing to fear through our silence. We are not in the war, either with knife or words. We are too old now to take up the art of mud-slinging, and we are convinced that when the fight is over it is the man that flung mud who will feel dirty. What we have ever said or written about Judge Malmin was what we knew, namely: that he was found to be a most unassuming, congenial, and democratic official who showed interest in the people and the place, on the bench, and on the street,—we wish him well. We do not presume to know anything whatever about the judge's relations with the government, etc., and hence can and will have no opinion to publish in regard

to his dismissal which came from the hand responsible for his appointment. We can have no sensible conclusions to arrive at in matters where we are ignorant of the facts; that's our general policy; and in adhering to it in this instance we hope to be on the sane side.
