ADDITIONAL MONEY BILL

To the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix for the fiscal year ending 30 June, 1921.

To the Department of Education (Maintenance) is hereby granted the sum of Fres. 23,812.00 for transfer to the Frederiksted High School Redemption Fund, and for further transfer to the Reserve Fund to cover the unpaid part of the loan of Fres. 25,000.00 for the purchase of the Frederiksted High School building; and a further sum of Fres. 312.50 for the reimbursement of Theodore Roosevelt Grammar School for overpayments of rent; provided that in future the Government may rent to private parties such part of the Frederiksted High School Building as may not be needed by the Department of Education, the money so received to be deposited in the treasury of the Municipality of St. Croix.

Thus duly passed by the Colonial Council for St. Croix at 2nd Discussion at its 5th Ordinary Meeting held Monday, February 4th 1921.
