TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

New York, July 27th.—The raw sugar market was easy at the opening and prices declined to the basis of $\frac{1}{8}$ cents for Cuba's cost and freight, equal to 6.91 for centrifugal. There were sale of 500,000 bags of Cuba's, for July and first half August shipment, to a local refiner. There was renewed selling pressure in raw sugar futures, prompted by the decline in the spot market and the easier London market, with prices during the early forenoon showing declines of 6 to 11 points. Covering brought about a partial recovery later and prices at mid-day were at 2 to 4 points net lower. Business in refined sugar continues of limited proportions at 8.75 for fine granulated.

London, July 26th. Via Halifax, July 25th.—The proposal made by the Jamaica Imperial Association in 1920 to Lord Burham, and again during last year, that a number of members of Parliament should pay a visit to the West Indies, has now been taken up by the West India Committee. The committee was assured four weeks ago of the cooperation of the Jamaica Imperial Association and then approached the other colonies. The proposal is that about 30 members of Parliament, accompanied by an equal number of ladies, shall visit the West Indies in January next. They will stay one week at Jamaica, where they will be entertained by the Jamaica Imperial Association.

London, July 27th.—The Liverpool Cup a handicap plate of 2,000 sovereigns, run over the course of one mile two furlongs at Liverpool this afternoon, was won

by Mrs. Haybourn's four year old bay colt "Suncharmer". Lord Derby's Mable, a three year old colt, finished second, beaten by a length, with Mr. Joe's five year old, Se Off, in the third place, beaten by two lengths. Nine horses ran.

FROM THE POLICE.

THE public is hereby notified that in the event of an impending hurricane, the following signals will be given:—

During the day. Upon receipt of information that a hurricane is approaching, ONE HURRICANE FLAG (a red flag with a black square in the centre) will be flown. If this island is in the path of the hurricane, TWO HURRICANE FLAGS, (one above the other) will be flown.

During the night. Two rockets will be fired at an interval of three minutes between the first and second. The above mentioned signals will be given from the forts in Christiansted and Frederiksted, as well as from the battery at King's Hill. The telephone centrals will inform all subscribers, (country ones first) of the approach of a hurricane.
