We have information that early incomplete returns of the bay rum industry of St. Thomas for the three months ended March 31, 1924 would seem to indicate that the export trade in this article would reach 27,000 gallons. A rough guess would thus make the trade for the year at least 100,000 gallons. The export trade of the past six years has been about as follows:
