2nd Member for St. Thomas Town
(Holst) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I
concur in the opinion expressed by the
last speaker. As a member of the Muni-
cipal Committee of St. Thomas I have
had to do with this resolution and know
that it is not all that could be desired,
but as the Federal Commission would
like to take the document to Washington
with them, and as there are many good
points in it I think it best that we accept
it, and if it is found out afterwards that
we need anything more we may forward
another resolution. I move that the re-
solution be adopted as proposed.
