TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, Jan. 24th.—The Prince of Wales everywhere in the state of Mysore Southern India, has received an enthusiastic welcome, even from the Mohammedans. According to information reaching the India office crowds have flocked to all ceremonies held in honour of the Prince and the student community, which especially in Bangalore, had been believed to be under the influence of the revolutionary movement, was prominent in welcoming the visitor. There was no unpleasant incident of any kind. The result of the visit of the Prince is declared to have been particularly gratifying after the non-cooperation activities of last Autumn, and the Kahlifat, activities in Bangalore during the past two years.

Lisbon, Jan. 25th.—The Portuguese Government, it was announced today, have notified the Allied council of ambassadors that Portugal will be unable to stand the expenses of supporting Ex-Emperor Charles of Austria Hungary and his wife Zita on the island of Madeira.

London, Jan. 25th.—An illustration of the chaotic condition the political parties of the United Kingdom are in, is afforded by a statement of Lord Robert Cecil, who still styles himself not as conservative, although he was elected a Coalitionist in the last general election but subsequently developed strong antipathy to the economic and foreign policies of the Government. In a speech yesterday, His Lordship declared that any Government with Viscount Grey as Premier would be bound to be composed of honest men, with an honest straight-forward policy, and whatever it was called,

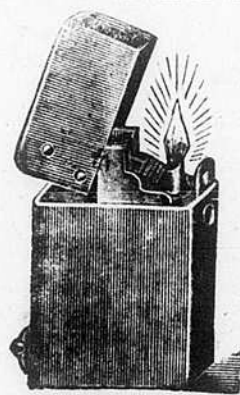
