"For all automobiles a distinguishing letter and number shall be prescribed by

provided with two sign-boards, one in front, and one at the back of the car, containing these distinguishing signs, easy to be read at a distance of 75 feet.

When in use between sunset and sunrise, the automobiles must be provided with a lighted lantern, which clearly illuminates the hind signboard," etc., etc.
