Applications to teach the above are requested to be submitted not later than the 20th September 1921.

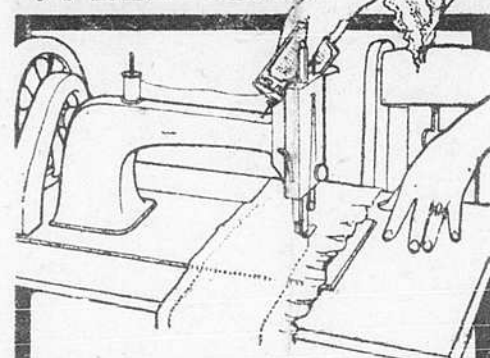
It is desired by the Department that applicants be qualified to teach some other elementary subjects such as Arithmetic, Geography, or History, as well as simple exercises in Wood Work.
