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LOCAL.

On approaching the dock on her arrival from St. Thomas yesterday the Creole collided with a projecting ledge of the jetty and had one of her planks partly staved in and some copper ripped off her bottom. Fortunately the damage was not considerable and with Capt. Møller on the job she was soon keeled over and overhauled. She sails for St. Thomas this morning and will carry the mail advertised to go by the Vigilant whose departure has been postponed it is advised.

The U. S. S. Tadousac called at this port yesterday evening and will remain here a couple of days it is understood. Among those who came over from St. Thomas by her were Secretary Timmons, and Bank-Director Holst who are among those comprising the commission appointed by Government to effect a settlement of the labor deadlock, also Rev. and Mrs. J. KU-KLUX-KLAN

There is at present a Congressional investigation into the affairs of an organization known as the Ku-Klux Klan.

The weird name has back of it a large number of atrocious crimes, committed by citizens of the United States whose motives were based on selfishness and ignorance.

The Ku-Klux-Klan is an organization made up of white men who claim to be one hundred per cent American, and who have conducted a secret form of hatred, directed against the Jews, Catholics and Negroes.
