TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Brussels, Aug. 27th.—The usefulness of exchanging diplomatic notes over the reparations question has been exhausted. The Allied Governments have completed their study of the problem and the time has arrived for resumption of direct conversations between the governments. These are the conclusions of Belgium's reply to the latest note from the British Foreign Secretary. The reply covers twenty five typewritten pages. While not indicating a time or place for the conference it advocates, the Belgian Government expresses the hope that, in as much as neither M. Poincare nor Mr. Baldwin seems hostile to the idea, direct negotiations on the question, which has been greatly clarified by the documents exchanged, should be scheduled as soon as possible.
