TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Cardiff, April 7th.—12,000 coal miners employed in the properties of Viscountess Rhondda are demanding that the Welsh coal strike be discontinued.

London, April 7th.—It is estimated that in Great Britain at the present time that there are nearly 700,000 workers involved in disputes with their employers and that some 56,000 are already on strike. These include the Welsh miners and the Norfolk farm workers. The employers of the building trades announce today a new schedule of wages and hours which will become effective on April 14th. If the men do not accept it, a lockout of nearly 500,000 workers may result.

Constantinople April 7th.—Another fortnight's respite from the enforcement of prohibition has been proclaimed. The suspicion is gaining ground that enforcement will never actually be applied to Constantinople. The evasive tactics by the "wets" will be used until the new assembly meets, when an effort to repeal the law will be made. Meantime the Allies have designated legal drinking resorts for Allied officers and men.

Simla, April 8th.—The plague is raging in almost all the provinces of India, the statistics for the week ending March 24th, giving 9,000 new cases for all India, of which 8,000 were fatal. The death rate is especially heavy in the central provinces, the united provinces, Bombay Presidency Punjab and Delhi. In Calcutta there have been only three deaths. All possible remedies and preventative measures have been taken by the authorities.
