TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Rome, Sept. 13th.—The Stefani Agency the semi-official Government news disseminator, says no ultimatum from the Italian Government exists, nor was one handed to Jugo-Slavia with regard to settling the status of Fiume. September 15th, he said, was fixed by the Rome and Belgrade Governments as the date for exchanging the decisions reached by the mixed Italian Jugoslav commission but this date was not considered as being a final proposition and there is nothing to prevent the two Governments from extending the date.

Quebec, Sept. 13th.—H. R. H. The Prince of Wales travelling as Lord Renfrew, left here this afternoon at 3.15 o'clock, accompanied by his suite. There was no demonstration at the station as the Prince and his suite boarded Lord Shaughnessy's special car "Killarney," which has been placed at the disposal of the Prince for his trip to and from his ranch in Alberta.

Quebec, Sept. 13th.—The cruiser "Capetown", flagship of the North Atlantic Squadron, bearing the flag of Vice-Admiral Culme-Seymour, will sail from Quebec today for maritime province ports. The "Capetown" which has been in port since Thursday last, is due to visit St. John N. B. September 24th to 27th before proceeding to her station in the West Indies.

Mineola, Sept. 13th.—New world's speed record of 244.15 miles an hour was established today by Lieut. Harold Brow, U. S. N., in a navy-Curtis racer flying over a one kilometre course at Mitchell field. The record announced was the
