Office-Request Envelopes

STAMPED envelopes with blank return-cards, known as "office-request" envelopes, are again on sale at this office. The return-card includes blank lines on which the user's name and local address or post office box may be written with pen, and names of post office and State, for example:

After.... days, return to

CHRISTIANSTED, St. Croix, V. I., U. S.

It is desired to encourage the use of "office-request" stamped envelopes by patrons as it is of much mutual benefit to the public and the postal service. When purchasers of these envelopes complete the card by writing their names and local addresses on the blank lines, it provides prompt return of undeliverable letters to senders, lessens the work of the Division of Dead Letters, and tends to encourage the use of return-cards on other mail.

Plain stamped envelopes are also kept on sale for purchasers who prefer to print their own return-cards in special styles; also newspaper wrappers of the 1c. denomination.

It is brought to attention that the envelopes are all of standard quality, and are sold in any number, from a single envelope to a thousand at the thousand rate. The price of the envelope is but a fraction above the face value of the stamp embossed on it.

bridles, and 2 saddle blankets are stricken. I understand that those are to be used for country inspection. I would like to know how the Inspectors will be able to perform their country inspection if those items are stricken?

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) in answer to the last Speaker said,—Mr. Chairman. These changes were made after consultation with the Head of the Department, and the Municipal Committee was informed that the men are paid extra for furnishing their own horses, and the horses are fed by the Department.

1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I have been told by one Inspector that he has to furnish his own horse for country inspection, and that he does not receive any extra compensation for that. There is something wrong about this matter.

The Chairman remarked: I am informed by an officer of the Sanitary Department that the Inspectors are furnish-

ing their own horses, and they are paid \$10.00 each per month extra for that.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): That's the way it was explained to the Municipal Committee.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I would suggest that the Inspectors use automobiles in making their rounds.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. The Chairman of the Municipal Committee has given his explanation on this matter. I understand that the Inspectors are furnishing their own horses and the Department pay for the horses and feed them. I presume that is correct. The Head of the Department was present and made this statement.

The Chairman remarked: I received the information from the Head of the Department, he ought to know something about it. The Honorable 1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson) must have been misinformed.

1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I will make an investigation into this matter. We stand here representing the people, and if any one comes to make a complaint to either of us that complaint must be based on truth.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. May be that Inspector is hiring the horse and renting to the Department as his own.

No further remarks. The items under this Department was put to the vote as amended.

8 members voted for; none against.

Dental Service—No remarks, read and put to the vote.

7 members voted for; none against.

Poor Department—No remarks. Put to the vote and unanimously adopted.

King's Hill Poor Farm—No remarks. Read as amended, put to the vote and unanimously adopted.

Public Instruction. No remarks. Read as amended and put to the vote.

7 members voted for; none against.

Subsidies to Private Grammar School. No remarks. Read as amended and put to the vote.

7 members voted for; none against.

Maintenance Public Libraries. No remarks. Read as amended, put to the vote and unanimously adopted.

Public Works Department.

The Chairman remarked: I see under salaries for this department it is suggested to change the Messenger's salary from Frs. 720 to Frs. 300, that means five dollars per month. This amount seems too small to pay a responsible person.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: The Assistant Public Works Officer was present and told the Municipal Committee that he hadn't sufficient work for a messenger, but the Dispatching Secretary's office is giving him
