It is hereby made known that whereas the following Member of the Colonial Council elected by the country district of Christiansted.

2nd Member Svend Jorgensen has died, Government resolved in virtue of article 28 of the Colonial law that a SPECIAL ELECTION of a member to the Council in lieu of the said gentleman shall take place in the Court House of Christiansted jurisdiction on Saturday July 30 1921.

The polling will commence at 1 o'clock p. m. in accordance with article 30 of the Colonial law will close at 4 o'clock p. m. at the earliest.

At the election no one can be considered unless he has announced himself as a candidate or has been so announced by one of the electors of the electoral district. The announcement of candidature shall either be made in writing or by personal attendance of the announcer at the Electoral Board.

The written announcement signed by the announcer (announcers) must be sent to the undersigned Chairman at my official office not later than 4 o'clock p. m. on July 26, and for receiving announcement made personally, the Electoral Board will meet at the place where the election is to be held at 3 o'clock p. m. on Wednesday July 27.

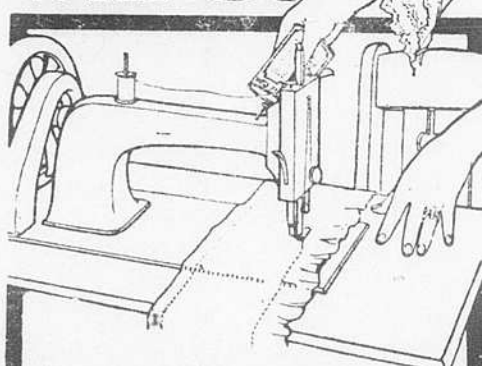
