TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Calshot, Eng. March 25th—Britain's effort to beat America in the first airplane flight around the world started today. At 12.00 this afternoon Commander Stuart MacLarine, first of the three flyers to get under way, took off from here for Lyons, France, on the first leg of the long air journey. The American flyers, who plan to go West, while the British go East, are now on the Pacific Coast, preparing to cross that ocean.

Athens, March 25th.—The National Assembly voted today to dethrone the Dynasty and proclaim a Republic. The motion was carried by a unanimous vote and is effective at once. Because of the possibility of a rupture in diplomatic relations with foreign countries, whose representatives are accredited to the "Regent of Greece" the Government has decided to maintain Admiral Coundouritis in the regency for the present. The Government will appropriate as soon as possible all removable property of the Glucksbourg Dynasty.

London, March 25th.—The Daily Express Jerusalem Correspondent quotes King Hussein of the Hedjaz who is hailed as Caliph by the Arabs, as declaring that he will fight "political zionism" with all the forces of the Moslem World. He will ask financial, political and moral support for this fight at the Pan-Moslem Congress, which he has summoned at Mecca.

Washington, March 25th.—Honduras revolutionists are in complete possession of the entire country with the exception of Tegucigalpa the Capital, the United States Minister reported today to the State Department.
