FROM THE POLICE.

ALL owners of dogs are enjoined with in the ending of January month to procure from the Police Office (for Kingshill District from Kingshill Police Station) the signs for dogs prescribed by the Police Regulations, which according to same must always be worn by the dog, and for which Francs 10.00 must be paid for dogs in town and Francs 2.00 for dogs in the country.

After said time dogs met not wearing the sign for 1921 will be caught and brought to the Police Office (Kingshill Police Station) and detained for 3 times 24 hours, when it will be killed, unless the owner appears to claim the dog, pays a fine of Francs 15.00 and eventually procures the required sign.

The Secretary read the bill and the Chairman put same to the vote.

It was unanimously adopted.

After the Order of the Day had been exhausted 1st. Member for Christiansted Country District [Stakemann] remarked: I would like to make some remarks in connection with a matter that is not on the Order of the Day if the Chairman has no objections.

The Chairman gave consent. The speaker continuing said: Mr. Chairman. I would like to know whether the Commission for the Leper Asylum is existing or whether it does not exist?

The Chairman was understood to say. It has been abolished.

1st. Member for Christiansted Country District [Stakemann] remarked: I expected to hear this, but it cannot be abolished by the Council, seeing that this would infringe upon the rights of a third party guaranteed by Section 9 of the Ordinance of 1907. The Member read the

Section referred to and continuing said. This Asylum was founded by the Odd Fellows Lodge in Denmark and was turned over by them to the Council on behalf of the Municipality on August 26, 1909, and according to law and the deed of conveyance to the Municipality of the Asylum, that society has the right to appoint a Member of the Commission for the Asylum, subject to the approval of the Governor. The Grand Sire has the right, subject to the approval of the Governor, to appoint the head sicknurse. These are the conditions made by the Odd Fellows in making the gift to the community of St. Croix. In conformity with this I have received a letter from the Grand Sire of the Lodge asking me to accept membership of this Commission; at the same time he has forwarded to me a letter to be handed to the Governor asking to have the appointment approved.
