The Post Office desires to bring to the notice of the public that the sale of War-savings Certificate Stamps of the series of 1919 will cease at close of business on December 31, 1919, and that War-Savings Stamps of the series of 1920 will be placed on sale beginning January 1, 1920. The 1919 stamps **POSITIVELY WILL NOT** be sold after December 31, and to avoid disappointment as has proved the case when previous issues were no longer obtainable, patrons and those wishing to complete collections, are advised to secure their stamps before that date. The 1920 issue of W. S. S. is printed on white paper with white lettering on a red ground, and contains a photogravure of Washington, the general design being the same as in former issues.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from Saturday's Avis.)

1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Coulter) introduced his amendment saying, -Mr. Chairman. I am so much in sympathy with the move made by the Honorable 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) that in spite of the criticisms offered I propose the amendment which the Chairman has read so as to procure the same for Frederiksted. I ask you gentlemen to further the amendment that similar provisions may be made for Frederiksted.

It was put to the vote and carried that the amendment be furthered.

By unanimous consent of the Council 1st Discussion closed.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I am one that do not believe in breaking

the Rules of Business and have taken objections to that, but in a case like this I do not believe any one will take objection. I therefore propose that 2nd Discussion come on today.

1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Coulter) seconded the member's proposal.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I believe there are other ways and means whereby the burial of the dead can be provided rather than appropriate this money at this present time. I feel that this matter should be investigated, and for this reason, I move that it go over until the next meeting of the Council.

The Chairman put the proposal made by 2nd Appointed Member [Noll] to the vote.

2 members voted for; 6 against.

The Chairman put the proposal made by 2nd Member for Christiansted Town to the vote.

11 members voted for; none against.

Government having given consent 2nd Discussion was opened.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town [Canegata] remarked: Mr. Chairman. Just before the meeting the Hon. 2nd Appointed Member spoke to me about this matter and he gave me some idea, but I do not believe that the means suggested by him would meet the wishes of the community. My personal opinion is, the suggestion made by him will not meet with the wishes of the community.

2nd Appointed Member [Noll] was of the opinion that it would be better to use the ambulance instead of the horse and hearse proposed.

1st Member for Frederiksted Town [Coulter] remarked: Mr. Chairman. I do not think it practicable to use the ambulance, it may conflict very much with the use it is being put to at present. The ambulance may be out in the country at the time it is required and don't return for hours after. I do not think it practicable at all.

1st Member for Christiansted Country District [Stakemann] would like to know whether any provision is made in the Bill for a driver for the hearse?

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) replied: The grave diggers are permanently employed and can be used to drive the hearse.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I do not care to offer an amendment to this bill, but it seems to me that the Police Department is not the proper department to charge with this duty. In Frederiksted the Police Department is not maintaining any animals. It seems to me that the Sanitary Department is in a better position to take care of this matter. I think it would be more feasible to charge the Sanitary Department with this duty.
