PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Concluded from yesterday's Avis.)

The Chairman remarked: I will now take up the Order of the Day.

Item 1.

Production of copy of Minutes of the Municipal Committee for the Quarter ending March 31, 1922, forwarded by the Chairman of the Committee for inspection of Members of the Council.

The Chairman remarked: The By-Law for the Municipal Committee requires that the proceedings of the Municipal Committee be laid on the table for inspection of Members; I will now lay copies before you and for one week after will be in the Council Office for inspection daily from 9 a. m. to 12 and from 2 to 5 p. m. daily.

Accordingly copies of the minutes for the quarter ending March 31, 1922 were laid on the table.

Item 2.

Colonial Council Bill No. 14.

Continuation of 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 14, introduced by 4th Member for Frederiksted Country District (Fleming), providing for the repairing and rolling of the center line road, with Committee Report.

The Report reads as follows:

COMMITTEE REPORT
on Ordinance providing for the repairing and rolling of the center line road.

The Committee appointed to report on Colonial Council Bill No. 14, Session 1921-1922, after careful consideration recommends that the Council suspend detail action on this ordinance at the present time, but appropriate a sufficient amount for the purchase of a road roller, scarifier and stone crusher.

To expedite the matter which is considered urgent, the speaker of the Committee has been instructed to introduce an additional money bill to cover the cost.

4th Member for Frederiksted Country District (Fleming) asked that the Council suspend action on the Bill until the Committee Report is adopted by the Council.

The Chairman asked the Speaker of the Committee Report to speak on the Report.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) remarked: Mr. Chairman. The Committee Report speaks for itself. With regard to the first bill brought in, the Committee was of the opinion that on account of present condition it might meet with objections, at the same time we deemed it necessary to do something to keep our roads in order, so the Committee decided to bring this in to provide for a road roller, scarifier and a stone crusher. It is the desire of the Committee that this matter be
