LOCAL.

Appreciable rain showers fell in Frederiksted yesterday and in the country district from Estate Slob westward. This town with surrounding rural vicinity has not been so fortunate, the dry spell still being inflexible. The lack of drinking water is a grave matter which grows more and more serious, and we can but wonder where it will end. Owing to the scarcity of sufficient rain water for the purpose, some ice is being manufactured from spring water for use in refrigerators, and for churning purposes.

The S. S. Guiana arrived at Frederiksted at day-break today, and will sail for St. Kitts this afternoon. A car has been dispatched for the letter mail which is, therefore, expected to be to hand early, the parcel post, etc. to be forwarded later.

The Postmaster is advised that the Guiana has 30 bags mails for Christiansted, and that the Creole sailed last night with 115 bags for the island.

After yesterday's rain the appearance of the center line road with its rugged ruts, indentations, and patches of rough gravel, presented a most convincing demonstration of the need for repair of this public highway, the numerous pools of water bearing unquestionable testimony to the irregularity of the road bed, and the impaired curvature of the surface.
