tificates must pay \$25 in future. The fee for endorsing passports will be \$10. Owners, agents or masters of vessels, on which Chinese are employed, on entering Canadian ports must place cash bonds of \$1,000 for every Chinese employee. While in port Chinese members of the crew will not be allowed to land.

Sydney, N. S. July 14th.—Following the conferences in Sydney at which the Premier, Mr. Armstrong, Dr. Clarence Mackinnon and representatives of the steel workers union and the British Empire Steel Corporation attended, no important developments have occurred in the Cape Breton strike area. All parties to the disputes have apparently adopted a watchful waiting policy and from every section where the strike is in progress comes word of unusual quietness.

Lyons, France, July 14th.—France and Switzerland broke even in the first days of their semi-final in the Europe Davis Cup elimination. Blanchy, of France, defeated A. E. Sohlman, of Switzerland, 6-4, 6-3, 6-4. The Swiss was not playing up to his usual form. Martin, of Switzerland, defeated Cochet of France, 4-6, 7-5, 3-6, 6-1, 6-3. Martin played a steady game and made some wonderful passing shots. The winner of the tie will meet Spain in the final for the European zone.

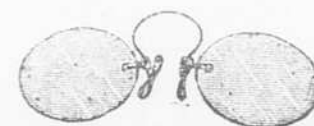
