Ottawa, Jan. 25th.—Canadian organized labour will be represented at the coming inter-Empire Conference, representative both of the trade union movement and the political labour movement which is to be held in London during the British Empire Exhibition.

London, Jan. 25th.—It is reported that Mr. MacDonald has offered the appointment of British Ambassador to Berlin, when the Ambassadorship becomes vacant, to the well known journalist Mr. H. W. Massingham.

Berlin, Jan. 26th.—An alleged Communist plot for the overthrow of the Government was brought to light today in the debate of the Finance Committee of the Wurttemberg Parliament, according to advices from Stuttgart. Large quantities of explosives are said to have been seized.

Tokio, Jan. 26th.—In accordance with ancient customs the wedding of the Prince Regent Hirohito and Princess Nagako, eldest daughter of Prince Kuni, was celebrated at the Imperial Palace this morning with Shinto rites.

London, Jan. 26th.—The wooden barriers which were erected at the entrance to the Downing Street residence of the Premier two years ago, as a protection against possible damage resulting from demonstrations by Sinnfeiners and unemployed, are to be removed by order of the new government. This is a reversal of a decision of the former administration.

London, Jan. 26th.—The new government receives an encomium from the Daily News, the Liberal Organ, on its giving to the Press an authoritative statement of the proceedings of the first cabinet council of the Labour Government. The Daily News expresses appreciation of this in view of the fact that the Labour Party has been bitterly aggrieved at what it is considered deliberate hostility and misrepresentation on the part of the majority of the English newspapers.

London, Jan. 26th.—Senator Wilson of Australia has departed for Canada where he will continue the negotiations begun in London for a Canadian-Australian trade agreement.
