

Executive Order No. 20.

EXECUTIVE Order No. 9, issued 24 January, 1920, requiring that bay rum shall be sold only on delivery of a permit issued by the Police Department, is so far modified that bay rum may be sold locally without permit from Police Department, *provided* that bay rum so sold without permit shall contain one of the modifying agents enumerated below; and provided further that the label on each bottle so sold without permit shall be so printed or stamped in red ink in as to indicate plainly the modifying agent and number of grains per ounce used.

The alternative modifying agents are:

Salicylic Acid	5 grains per fluid ounce.
Quinine Sulphate	2 grains " " "
Chinchonidine Sulphate	2 grains " " "
Resorcin	5 grains " " "

Bay rum which has not been modified by the use of one of the agents indicated above shall be sold locally only under permit issued by the Police Department as heretofore required.

The penalties provided by Ordinance approved 9 July, 1918, shall apply in cases of violations of this Order.

NOTICE.

ON September the 5th 1920 His Majesty the King of Denmark sanctioned the Law concerning acquirement of Danish citizenship in consequence of the incorporation in Denmark of the South Jutlandish districts.

Any person born in the South Jutlandish districts and possessed of German citizenship, shall acquire Danish citizenship, if, within June the 15th 1922 he makes a declaration of option, provided only that, if he does not even then reside here, he shall in the course of the next 12 months after having made the declaration, take up his residence in Denmark. As to opting persons not residing in Germany, dispensation with the requirement of settlement in Denmark may, however, be obtained from the Ministry of Home Affairs, unless the person in question is possessed of citizenship also in the country, where he is residing.

Any person who, according to the above, wishes to make a declaration of option, will have to apply personally or in writing to the Royal Danish Consulate at St. Thomas before December the 31st 1921, where further particulars will be given.
