

Saturday last a fresh breeze developed into a hard gale from the west which the "Renown" met head on. The Prince observed the magnificent spectacle from the observation bridge, while huge seas, driven by the westerly gale, raved at the "Renown" which charged them at a speed of 20 knots sending the water mast head high, the spray falling into continuous cascades in which rainbows appeared. On Monday when the "Renown" was entering the great Australian Bight, the gale became fiercer and the ship was slowed down to seventeen knots and fifteen, then finally eleven. The eleven officers on board the "Renown" since she was commissioned, say it was the worst weather the ship has experienced. They express the opinion that the waves in the Australian bight were higher than in the Atlantic. The heavy seas coming on board on the upper deck on the starboard side swept through the steam picket boat, breaking all fittings and also damaged the Prince's launch, smashing all the cabin windows and carrying away the sails. Admiral Halsey states that the "Renown" proved herself a beautiful seaboat. Today the fury of the gale has abated, but the sea is still running very high and confused. The Prince entered Albany Thursday afternoon, after being welcomed by the State Governor, and by the Major, Councillors and the people. From Albany the Prince resumed the journey to Perth by train.

**San Francisco, July 5th.**—The Democratic National Convention went into its ninth session and its twenty-third ballot today for a presidential nominee. There was nothing to indicate that any marked change was in prospect from the last roll call of Saturday night. The twenty-second ballot had left the four leaders as follows: Cox 430, McAdoo 272½, Palmer 166, Davis 52. A remaining 70 votes were scattered among the other contenders, Owen, Glass and Cummings with two recorded for President Wilson and a couple for Champ Clark. It has been a rule of Democratic Conventions under the two-thirds nomination rule that the first man to secure a majority which would be 548 votes on the full roll of this convention got the nomination. On the face of the 22nd ballot Palmer forces were holding the key to the door to a majority.

**London, July 4th.**—The Henley Regatta was a wonderful success the winners won the Grand Challenge Cup, Magdalene College, Oxford. Wyford Cup, Thames Rowing Club. Silver Goblets, Nickalls and Lucas of Magdalene College, Diamond Scull, J. Beresford, Junior Thames Rowing Club. Beresford defeated D. H. L. Collon. Beresford took the lead by a half length at the quarter mile and won by three lengths on 8 minutes and 57 seconds.
