TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, July 30th.—Sir Charles Hawtrey, noted actor and theatrical Manager, died today after a short illness.

London, July 30th.—Lord Haldane, addressing the education conference here protested against the expenditure of 10,000,000 pounds on Singapore as a naval base, as proposed by the Government. The Admiralty, however, was a potent department of the Government, he said, because the sea was a great tradition with Englishmen. The expenditure at Singapore would mean more cuts in the appropriation for education, which also ought to be a great English tradition, Lord Haldane said. Against this view expressed by Lord Haldane, is placed a statement made at another educational gathering by Sir Donald MacLean, ex-M. P., who said that 87,000,000 pounds had been raised this year for education in Great Britain, or about 24,000,000 more than was spent on the navy.

London, Aug., 1st.—The cricket match between the West Indian touring XI and Gloucestershire at Bristol was abandoned yesterday on account of rain.

Montreal, July 30th.—Great Britain will contribute a quota of labour for harvesting operations in Western Canada this year, as the Canadian Pacific Railway expect to bring out at least one thousand men under the cheap fares policy inaugurated by all steamship lines between Canada and Great Britain. Under this, men will be transported from a British port direct to Winnipeg for a round sum of approximately \$53.50, or 12 pounds, while a correspondingly low fare will be granted for the return journey to England.

London, July 30th.—The Central News Correspondent at Berlin has sent the following despatch here. Your correspondent learns in well informed political quarters that the resignation of the Cuno Cabinet is certain. Herr Cuno himself is convinced that this step must be taken. It is understood that the leaders of the new cabinet will be Paul Loeb President of the Reichstag, and Dr. Gustave Vresemann, leader of the people's party. A definite decision will not be reached before the meeting of the Reichstag at the end of next week.

Aix-La-Chapelle, July 31st.—The Belgian forces of occupation today expelled the burgomaster and five members of the Municipal Council of this city. No reason for the expulsion of the Germans was announced.

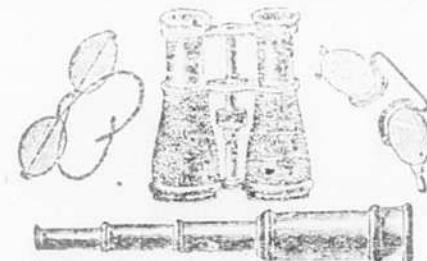
