It is hereby brought to public notice that the Governor of the Virgin Islands of the United States was today officially advised by radio that an Act of Congress signed by the President 12 July, 1921, and effective 1 July, 1921, contained the two following provisions:

"Provided that no person owing allegiance to any country other than the United States of America shall be eligible to hold office as a member of the Colonial Councils of the Virgin Islands of the United States nor to hold any public office under the Government of said islands:

Provided further that the income tax laws now in force in the United States of America and those which may hereafter be enacted shall be likewise in force in the Virgin Islands of the United States except that the proceeds of such taxes shall be paid into the treasuries of said islands."
