There was born the idea of a United nation to take its place among the nations of the earth, by which was formed the superior nations with authority, and yet, without power in any degree to encroach. To Alexander Hamilton this is due.

Then came the trying period by which it was necessary to secure the adoption of the Constitution; from the people in every Colony came opposition, especially in New York, the Governor of the State, Judge Clinton, was opposed to the Constitution; Alexander Hamilton threw the weight of his judgment in the balance throughout the trying days of the long period and he won against a great majority; had it not been for that success there would have been no Constitution of the United States. I will not speak of his services further, I speak that you might know the superior feeling and admiration which we feel for Alexander Hamilton in the United States. He arranged the fiscal and finance system of the United States and it rose to its feet, he struck the rock of finance and it flowed a golden stream. You should grow in admiration of the American Flag, of Alexander Hamilton's service to the United States and to the world. I thank you Mr. Chairman.
