1,000,000 and the country for only about Frs. 500,000, hospitals included. There is something wrong in the whole thing, we should be more economical. I do not think it is fair to expect to make the island self supporting with the heavy cost of maintaining the two towns, carried so largely by taxing the country properties.

2nd Member for Frederiksted Country District [M. M. Skeoch] remarked: Mr. Chairman I cannot see how it is possible for any member of this Council to pass an opinion intelligently on these matters. There are many items referred to by the Honorable Speaker regarding the Sanitary Department to which one cannot give an idea. I do not see how one can get a right idea as to whether one item is too high or too low. It seems as if the heads of these departments should be called in to give elucidations on the various items. I attended two meetings of the Municipal Committee as substitute for Mr. Fleming, there were, during these meetings, a great deal of talk, but nothing was done. I do not see how any one can sit here and give an opinion on these items; take the Hospitals for instance, Dr. Canegata is the only one here who is able to say whether the amounts are too high or too low.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. Up to this budget we have always had the Government Secretary come over and go through the budget with us. If the Municipal Committee must discuss this budget as it ought to and make recommendations, it must have elucidations from the various departments and also from the Despatching Secretary. Under the old regime the proposed budgets were always compared with the previous year's budget and a budget committee appointed, and we generally had five or six weeks to go through them. That procedure gave us the opportunity to compare the budgets and get ideas of what we were talking about. Under this budget we have a great many new institutions with which we are not familiar and can only know something about them by elucidations from the various departments. We ought to have at least three or four meetings on a budget so as to get a clear understanding of what we are doing and to enable us to do the right thing. The Member then read the revenue side of the budget, and continuing said,—There is a pretty high deficit; if the Federal Government would be always willing to make up deficits it will be all well and good, but we cannot pay more taxes as we are pretty well taxed at present.

To get a clear understanding of a budget, to see whether there is a possibility to increase or reduce amounts, it needs more time and it needs elucidations from the various departments.
