Owing to many persons making payments of large amounts in coin, mostly loose, involving needless loss of time and labor to count and wrap up, the provisions of paragraph 3, section 333, Postal Laws and Regulations, limiting the amount of copper and nickel coin that may be accepted, to 25 cents, and fractional silver to \$10.00, will be enforced in cases where loose coin is tendered at this office

It being apparent that no useful purpose is served by the delivery of mail on Saturday evening, this practice will be discontinued, and the provisions of the regulations by which post offices of the third class are not required to open, assort and deliver on the same evening mail that arrives after close of local business hours, observed in future. There will, therefore, be no delivery of the Virginia's mail on Saturday evening when it reaches this office after close of business, 5 p. m. Under such circumstances this mail will be delivered on Sunday, and notice of the time when the office will be opened for delivery will be posted as early beforehand as practicable.

TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London Aug. 17th.—Sugar in stock on the 14th. instant was 145,000 tons. Last year 203,000 tons.

Paris, Aug. 17th.—Mr. Adamson, Labour member of the British Parliament, and Mrs. Gosling, Leader of the English Transport Workers representing the British Council of Action of the Triple Alliance of Labour, have been requested to leave France, failing which they will be expelled. The two arrived this morning and conferred with French Socialists.

Ramsgate, Aug. 17th.—A serious clash occurred early today between the police and a crowd which was bent on preventing the loading of two German ships. The steamers arrived several days ago for cargoes of coke, but owing to the hostility of ex-soldiers and others because of the nationality of the vessels, no attempt was made to load the craft until this morning.

London, Aug. 17th.—A Royal proclamation states that the Prince of Wales will not visit India next winter to inaugurate reform legislation. The Duke of Connaught will undertake these duties.
