PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

Item 3.

Colonial Council Bill No. 16.

Introduction of and 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 16, Draft of Additional Money Bill to the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1922, introduced by 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch); granting Frs. 50,000.00 for the purpose of procuring a road roller, scarifier and stone crusher.

Colonial Council Bill No. 16.

Third Council, First Session, 1921-1922.

DRAFT OF ADDITIONAL MONEY BILL

to the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix, 1921-1922.

Sub Item 50. Maintenance — Public Works Department.

The public Works Department is hereby granted..... Frs. 50,000.00 from funds in the Colonial Treasury not otherwise obligated, for the purpose of procuring a road roller, scarifier and stone crusher.

This amount to be expended only after consultation with the Road Commission.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) in introducing the Bill said,—"Mr. Chairman. I was instructed by the Committee on Colonial Council Bill No. 14 to introduce this measure so as to enable us to keep our roads in repair. The Speaker read the Bill and said—"We have a good deal of large stones, which, formerly were broken by hand, but that procedure is considered too expensive today, and as the service the road is put to today demands better materials we thought it best to get a road roller, scarifier and stone crusher. I recommend the Bill to the favorable consideration of the Council.

Government Secretary (Gaffney) remarked: Mr. Chairman. Government, in setting forth certain objection to Colonial Council Bill No. 14, laid down the fundamental principle to be followed in the matter of the Ordinance working in St. Croix. The Ordinance, as at present drafted, is satisfactory to Government, and any change, piecemeal, or as a whole, must carry with it the means for raising the funds. Colonial Council Bill No. 16, should therefore, carry with it the means for raising the Frs. 50,000, and some amendment made setting forth the terms under which equipment is to be used.

District (Andersen) would like to know whether the Bill is under 1st or 2nd Discussion?

The Chairman answered: Under 1st Discussion

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) moved that 1st Discussion be closed.

The Member's motion was put to the vote.

13 Members voted for; none against.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. In view of the remarks fallen from the Government Secretary we should have some more discussion on 1st Discussion. The Bill reads: "From funds in the Colonial Treasury not otherwise obligated". He says that cannot be done; therefore if the bill is passed as it is before us now it may not be approved by the Governor.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen): That's the reason why I moved that 1st Discussion be closed. If we pass the bill in its present form and the Governor cares to veto it, let him do so.

3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch) remarked: Mr. Chairman. It seems to me there is some reason for blocking this measure every time it comes up in the Council. It sounds peculiar to me that Government is not willing to give some help. I feel just like the last speaker, and I move that 1st Discussion be closed.
