ST. CROIX STATION.

London, Nov. 11th.—The ex-German Crown Prince's startling flight from Holland and the Dutch Governments cool response to the allied representations are featured conspicuously in London's Sunday papers, which speculate on whether the Allies will force Germany to give Frederick William up. Some of the papers, line the flight with the Ludendorff adventure in Bavaria and say that if the Munich coup had been better organized, Europe would be confronted with an attempt to restore the Hohenzollern Dynasty. The development, in their opinion, introduces another international complication in a situation already bewildering in its complexity and they assert that the presence of the former Crown Prince in Germany provides a dangerous rallying point for the reactionary elements.

Amsterdam, Nov. 11th.—The Dutch enthusiasts were completely surprised by the sudden departure from Holland of the ex-Crown Prince, Frederick William of Germany over the German frontier yesterday in an automobile enroute to his estate at Oels, Upper Silesia. When Dr. Kan of the ministry of the interior, who had been especially charged with the surveillance of the ex-Kaiser and his son, was asked shortly before noon if the rumour of the latter's departure was true, he expressed doubt and said that personally he did not believe it. Later the report was confirmed in a semi-official statement.

Berlin, Nov. 11th.—Dr. Von Hoesch, German Charge D'Affaires at Paris, has been instructed to make the following reply to the Council of Ambassadors' note

asking whether the German Government has granted the ex-Crown Prince permission to return to Germany. "The ex-Crown Prince several weeks ago asked permission to return to Germany. On studying the request, the German Government could find no judicial practical reason for refusing him, while in his capacity as a German citizen, permission to return to his family. I therefore empowered its representatives abroad to furnish the former Crown Prince with a passport authorizing him to enter Germany".
