PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Concluded from yesterday's Avis.)

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. I agree with some of the remarks made by the last Speaker. With reference to the guns, while they are ornamenting the wharf, they are at the same time an obstruction, particularly when merchandise is being landed. Under the former Administration the Inspector of Customs, Mr. Andersen, was very careful, he always gave a time limit for the removal of lumber and other goods that were landed on the wharf. The Honorable 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District is justified in bringing this matter before the Council, because some people are infringing a great deal on the rights of this Municipality. I would have no objection to a man having something on the wharf for a month or two, but when it comes to two or three years I cannot agree.

2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (Berg) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. With regard to remarks made by the 4th Member for Frederiksted Country District I wish to say that the guns cannot be considered as monuments. If they are they form an ob-

struction and is contrary to Police Regulations. (The Speaker read a Paragraph from the Police Regulations) and continuing said, —If the guns were given to the Municipality they could be erected in such a way as could ornament the wharf and yet not form an obstruction.

Despatching Secretary (Barrett) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. The guns will be taken away both from Christiansted and Frederiksted this week. I am sure the Federal Government would be very, very thankful to this Municipality

if it would take the contract for moving these guns for the sum of \$50.00. The primary visit of the U. S. S. Antares to this Municipality is for the purpose of making preliminary arrangements for the removal of these guns.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): Who has charge of the wharf?

Despatching Secretary (Barrett): It is under the supervision of the Public Works Officer. The Police could be instructed to ask the owner of the engine to remove it from the wharf.

1st Appointed Member (Coulter): The Police Department has nothing to do with the wharf, it is under the control of the Collector of Customs.

4th Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen): This is an executive matter, not a legislative matter.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): I am glad that this Resolution has come up, because no one seems to know who has charge of the wharf. It is high time now that an officer be put in charge of it.

4th Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen): According to the old Danish Law the Custom Officer has charge of the wharf. I understand that the Custom Officer has charge of the wharf in Frederiksted.

The Vice-Chairman: The matter will go over until the next meeting so as to give time to find out who has charge of the wharf.

4th Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen): In view of the fact that we will soon have a visit of the fleet I suggest that the Despatching Secretary or the Chairman of the Colonial Council or the Chairman of the Municipal Committee write to the responsible party asking that the wharf be cleared.

Despatching Secretary (Barrett): I would be very glad to do that.

Further discussion on the Resolution was postponed until the next meeting.

The Vice-Chairman remarked: Two Interpellations addressed to the Chairman of the Council by the Honorable 2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (Berg) have been received and read to the Council. In answer to the first I can say that as far as I am aware the Chairman of the Council has no official knowledge as to the disposition of the Memorial. And to the second I wish to say that I do not feel myself competent to interpret the ordinance. We all have different ideas as to the interpretation of the law.

2nd Member for Christiansted Country District (Berg) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. I don't see how the Municipal Committee is going to use the Ordinance if they cannot interpret it. I ask this question because some of my constituents who are land-owners are asking me whether they are entitled to a loan or not. Personally I think the island would be helped if they are granted loans the same as squatters and parcelists. I
