TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, July 16th.—Official information regarding the status of Senator Belcourt of Canada, as a representative of the Dominion at the International Conference, which opened here today, is lacking, but it is understood that an arrangement satisfactory to Canada has not yet been agreed upon. The Daily News says the Government has suggested a panel arrangement whereby the Dominions would be represented at the sessions alternately. Representations are being made by the Dominions to the Colonial Office and in the meantime the delegates from the Dominions are marking time. Canada and Ireland demand a representation of their own, if they are to be bound by the conference decisions.

Delhi, B. I. July 16th—Six persons were reported killed and more than 100 wounded in rioting yesterday between Mohammedans and Hindus. The disturbance was caused by what is described as the aggressive attitude of the Mohammedans, who persisted in carrying cows for sacrifice through the prohibited areas where the Hindus live.

London, July 17th.—Sir Horace Byatt, Governor elect of Trinidad and Tobago, attended a meeting of the Executive of the West India Committee today. Sir Robert Rutherford presided at the meeting and there were also present Messrs Bell, Collins, Depass, Gurney, Guppy, Laborde, Malcolmson, Moody-Stuart, Murray, O'Reilly, Nowell, Rogers, Radcliffe-Clark, Warner,
