TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, June 30th. -The threatened strike in the engineering trades due to differences of the wage reduction question was averted today at a conference of representatives of the employers and the engineers. The conference accepted the provisional agreement which had been reached by committees representing the two sides to the controversy, the terms of which will be ballotted upon by the men within a fortnight.

London, June 30th. Special precautions are being taken to protect the Cabinet Minister in consequence of the discovery of a plot to murder them according to the "Daily Sketch." The paper says the police are seeking three men sent to London by certain organizations abroad for the purpose of assassinating the ministers. One is described as a French medical student a member of a Paris secret society. Another an Irishman from the western United States and the third a Spaniard of Irish extraction.

New York, June 30th. -The raw sugar market was firm and unchanged early today at four cents for centrifugal. Refined features were nominal with no transactions reported.

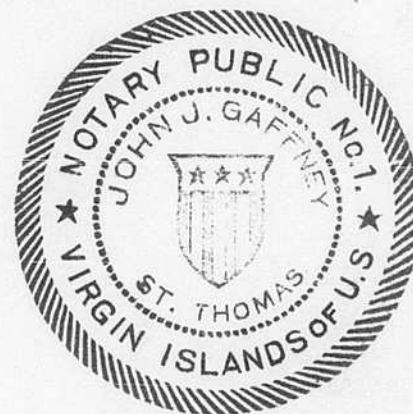
