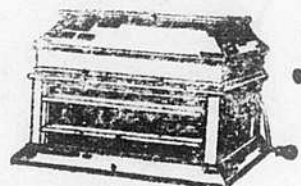


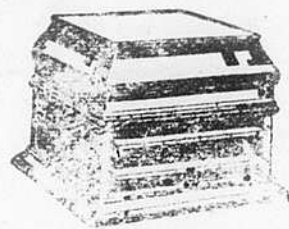

EDITORIAL.

In yesterday's issue space was given to a rather extensive review of the Christiansted harbor question as contributed by one of the many at this end who have the interest and welfare of their island home at heart, and who realize that most the advancement to which we lay claim in St. Croix lies in the solution of the harbor problem at this end. It is much to be regretted that the efforts made toward perfecting certain improvements were abandoned without so much as to a further word from our local legislative which was the suitable channel through which an appeal may have been made to the commission at Washington. Yet it is not too late to take this matter up afresh and giving it the proper attention accomplish more than ever was dreamed of before, as our correspondent warrantably considers. It has always been our opinion that the harbor at this end of the island could be made a suitable one without prejudicing the interests of Frederiksted where there unfortunately seems to exist a misunderstanding of our aspirations. The present administration of these islands is believed to have the welfare of the population constantly before it, and there is a strong conviction that our ap-

peals for harbor facilities, even on a moderate scale will not be made in vain. Let us bide our time, and await action which sooner or later must come.

The letter of Miss Hendrickson which appeared in the Emancipator, gives rise of an opportunity for the public to know that my activities with the Virgin Island Protective League became dormant through her efforts to impugn my motives and gain favor upon the views she has expressed, and of which I refused to be a party. In my opinion the question of color should not be discussed on the islands.

With a population over ninety percent of mostly color, where equal opportunities are afforded to adopt culture and refinement and to acquire intelligence there is not the slightest chance of oppression along the lines of race discrimination.

To discuss color and class, without creating a feeling of bitterness, is a very poor way to get JUSTICE for one and all, for the right of anyone to aspire
